Location: Moorpanyal Park, The Esplanade, North Shore

Date: Sunday 7th November

Time: 12noon to 2pm

Event details:

Outdoor picnic event to disseminate information on the campaign and for event participants to engage in some campaign activities.

Victorian COVID Restrictions relevant to this event include:

As per Victoria's Roadmap, as of 5th November 2021 regional Victoria and Metropolitan Melbourne will be subject to the same COVID restrictions, meaning the event can be accessed by locals as well as other Victorian residents wanting to support the campaign.

Up to 30 people can gather in public outside.

Masks are only required inside.

COVID Safety measures in place for this event:

For event participants:

It is recommended that event participants gather in groups up to 30 people (including dependents) but not more than 30 people to a group.

That groups BYO picnic blankets/chairs/food etc.

That groups socially distance from each other, and that we avoid intermingling between groups/sharing of food/utensils etc. between picnic groups.

Advise that individuals within groups attempt to social distance, and to wear face where not eating or drinking.

That people do not attend the event if feeling unwell or symptomatic.

That event participants use the QR code at Moorpanyal Park to check in via the Service Victoria app.

For event organisers:

To communicate the COVID safety plan ahead of the event and at the event to participants.

Event organisers to provide two COVID safety marshalls

To provide surgical masks and hand sanitizer for event attendees to use.

To provide anti-bacterial wipes to wipe down shared facilities during event such as taps, door handles to toilets etc.

For COVID safety marshalls:



COVID safety marshalls to assist in directing people to sign in using the QR code COVID safety marshalls to answer any questions event participants may have on the day regarding COVID safety measures

COVID safety marshalls to regularly wipe down shared facilities (taps, toilet door handles etc.)

COVID safety marshalls to ensure other event activities/stall holders are following the COVID safety plan.
